On May 26th, 1960 the National Zoological Park received a fine shipment of animals from India. The features of this shipment were 1 male Great Indian Rhinoceros and 5 Lesser Pandas. The Great Indian Rhino was acquired as a gift of the Indian Government and is named „Tarun“. „Tarun“ is a replacement for the Great Indian Rhino „Gunda“, who lived in the zoo from 1939 until his death in 1959. Also expected later in the summer is a pair of African Black Rhinos, which, in addition to the Great Indian Rhino and the pair of White Rhinos, will give the zoo 5 rhinos.

At present the Zurich Zoo exhibits a good collection of animal families, including 12 Collared Peccaries; 12 Rheas; 5 White-tailed Gnu; 5 American Bison; 6 Chapman's Zebra; 4 Greater Gnu; 6 Persian Gazelle; 7 Guanacos and 10 Beavers.
