Some of the outstanding mammals on exhibit in this zoo on 29 March 1961 included: 0-1 Lowland gorilla, which arrived in the zoo on 8 Sept. 1956; 1-2 Reticulated giraffe; 1-1 Hippopotamus; 0-1 Black rhino, acquired in 1954; 0-2 Asiatic elephants; and 1 Aard vark. The outstanding features of the zoo are the fine collections housed in the tropical bird house, aquarium; and new reptile house. The latter, known a sthe Herpetarium, was completed and opened on 20 Aug. 1960. The exterior of this very modern building is decorated with a full-scale metal abstraction of a Plesiosaur. The exhibits are shown in six halls allocated to the world's major geographic areas. A large Anaconda was displayed in an unusual exhibit employing an "invisible" glass front. Features included 1 Java wart snake, 1 Cribo, 1 Australian tiger snake, 1 King cobra, 1 Horned viper, 1 Saw scaled viper, 1 Blood python, 1 Amethystine python, 1 large Indina monitor 1 Gavial, and 2 Giant Australian skinks.
