Nuremberg - Germany

The most important new arrivals in the Nuremberg Zoo are the female Gorilla "Delphi" (there is now a trio of Gorillas in the Ape House), one pair of European Lynx and two Bearded Vultures (Gypaetus barbatus).

During the period June - October 1965, the following births have taken place; 1 Californian Sea Lion; 1 European V...4 Cat; 3 Fennec (Fennecus pallidus); 1 Hippo; 2 Grant's Zebra; 1 Damara Zebra; 1 Eland; 1 White-bearded Gnu; 2 Red Deer; 5 Dybowsky Deer; 5 Fallow Deer 2 Roes; 1 American Bison; and 2 African Porcupines.

The new large cage for birds of prey (100¹ x 37¹ x 25¹) has been completed and the first immates are 10 species of Eagles and Vultures, altogether 25 birds, all in excellent condition.

Also the new outdoor enclosure for the Tapirs is now completed and our three Saddle-backed Tapirs have settled down perfectly.

Okahandja - South West Africa

Interesting news from the Okahandja Zoopark is that on three occasions we have successfully bred 8 Brown Hyaena or Strand wolf (Hyaena brunnea) during 1965, in three litters from one pair of these rare carnivora, which are on the verge of extinction.

Births in the zoopark during 1965 were: Ass x Hartmann Mountain Zebra hybrids; Horse x Damara-Burchell Zebra hybrids; Gemsbok; Nyala; White-tailed Gnu; Blesbok; Springbok; Impala; Greater Kudu Gape Hartebeest; Gape Hunting Dogs: Slender-tailed Meerkats; and Cape Hyrax.

During the last six years the Okahandja Zoopark has bred and successfully reared 39 Bengal and Sumatran Tigers.

An exciting new addition to the Holden Museum of Living Reptiles is a Tuatara. Special permission from the New Zealand government must be obtained to remove one of these rare creatures from its native home.
