

long months at sea and then again seventeen years of touring shown to the public as an exotic curiosity


Douw Mout enjoyed it he travelled all over Lurope with this female collebrity at his side

In any case you could recognize the old maninside by the look in the eyes and the affection are behaviour


perhaps it's note of terrible to change into a rhino in long as it happens to everyon.

there he walked peacefully around a gentle little animal a dwarfy sub-pricies of the Sumatran rhino


you could chress him or pamper him otherwise he obviously felt at homenear the rhino lover
