- Rhubarb, *s.* math o wreiddyn meddygawr tra adnabyddus, ariantlys, arian gwiau
- Rhyme, *sub.* odl; cynghanedd; rhimyn: *v.* odli, cydodli, cyng- haneddu; mydrn, rhimynnt
- Rhymers, *s.* rhimynwr; odllydd
- Rhythm, *s.* mydr a chynghanedd
- Rhythical, *a.* cynghaneddol, mydraidd; cynghan-fesurol
- Rial, *s.* chwengain Yspaen
- Rib, *s.* asen, eisen, corf-asen (*pl.* aia, corf-aia)—Kiln-ribs, llym- wŷdâ odyn—Rib-timber, eis- goed, eisdrawstiu
- Ribald, *s.* croesan, croesaniad
- Ribaldrous, *a.* serth, croesanaidd, budr-eiriog; amlad
- Ribaldry, *a.* serthedd, croesan- iaeth, croesaren, budr-eiriad
- Riband, Ribbon, *s.* ysnoden
- Ribbed, *a.* eisawg, eisedig
- Ribbon-weaver, *s.* ynoden-w- ydd, ynodenwr
- Ribwort, *s.* llwynhîd, erlyriaid, yagelynnlys, pêmau y gwyr,

- Riddle, *s.* adam meg, dymeg, grymeg, dychymmyg, dyfal: rhidyll, jesgyn: *v.* rhidyllio
- Ride, *a.* marchgau, marchogaeth; notio wrth angor
- Rider, *s.* marchog; marchog-was
- Ridge, *sub.* grwa, trum, crimp, cefn, crib: *v.* grynio; trumio
- Ridgy, *adj.* trumiog, gryniog, crimpio, cribog, bryniog
- Ridge-band, *s.* cefndres
- Ridgealing, *s.* milyn neu unfaill un-gwâl
- Ridge-tile, *s.* crib-beithynen
- Ridicule, *sub.* gwawd, gwat- waredd, chwertynn-wawd, chwardd-wawd: *v.* gwawdio, gwatwar, mæcio
