Hybrid Wild Asses born in the Gardens:—

1. One 7 July, 1843: "between the Wild and Common Ass."
2. One 21 July, 1878: probably *Equus hemippus* ♂ × *E. indicus* ♀.
3. Male 30 June, 1883: *E. hemippus* ♂ × *E. asinus* ♀.
4. One in 1908: "*E. onager* × *E. hemionus*."
5. Male 27 Sept. 1920: "*E. kiang* × *E. asinus*."

646. *Rhinoceros unicornis* Linnaeus, Syst. Nat. 1, p. 56, 1758

Great Indian Rhinoceros.

Hab. India: now only occurs in some districts of north-eastern India.

Fig. T. Z. S. 9, 1876, pl. 95.

The first received was a male purchased 24 May, 1834, for £1,050, from Capt. Farquison: it died 19 Nov. 1849, having lived in the Gardens for 15 years 5 month 25 days.

647. *Rhinoceros sondaicus* Desmarest, Mammalogie 2, p. 399, 1822.

Sondaic Rhinoceros. Javan Rhinoceros.

Hab. South-eastern Asia: eastern India, Burma, Siam, Malay Peninsula, Sumatra, Java and Borneo.

Fig. T. Z. S. 9, 1876, pl. 96.

The first received was a young male purchased 7 March, 1874, for £800, from Messrs. Cross and Jamrach.

648. *Rhinoceros sumatrensis* G. Cuvier, Règne Anim. 1 p. 240, 1817.

Alternative name *Dicerorhinus sumatrensis*.

Asiatic Two-horned Rhinoceros.

Hab. South-eastern Asia: Assam, Burma, Siam, Malay Peninsula, Sumatra and Borneo.

Figs. T. Z. S. 9, 1876, pls. 97 & 98.

The first received was a female purchased 14 Feb. 1872, for £1,250, from Mr. William Jamrach: it died 31 Aug. 1900, and was the type of *Rhinoceros lasiotis* P. L. Selater, P. Z. S. 1872, p. 493. A second female, purchased 2 Aug. 1872, for £600, from Mr. W. Jamrach, was considered to be *R. sumatrensis*.

649. *Rhinoceros bicornis* Linnaeus, Syst. Nat. 1, p. 56, 1758.

Alternative name *Diceros bicornis*.

Black Rhinoceros.

Hab. Africa: from the Cape of Good Hope to Somaliland and the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan.

Fig. T. Z. S. 9, 1876, pl. 99.

The first received was a young male purchased 11 Sept. 1868, for £1,000, from Mr. C. Hagenbeck.
