

JAVAN RHINOCEROS—LONDON ZOOLOGICAL GARDENS.

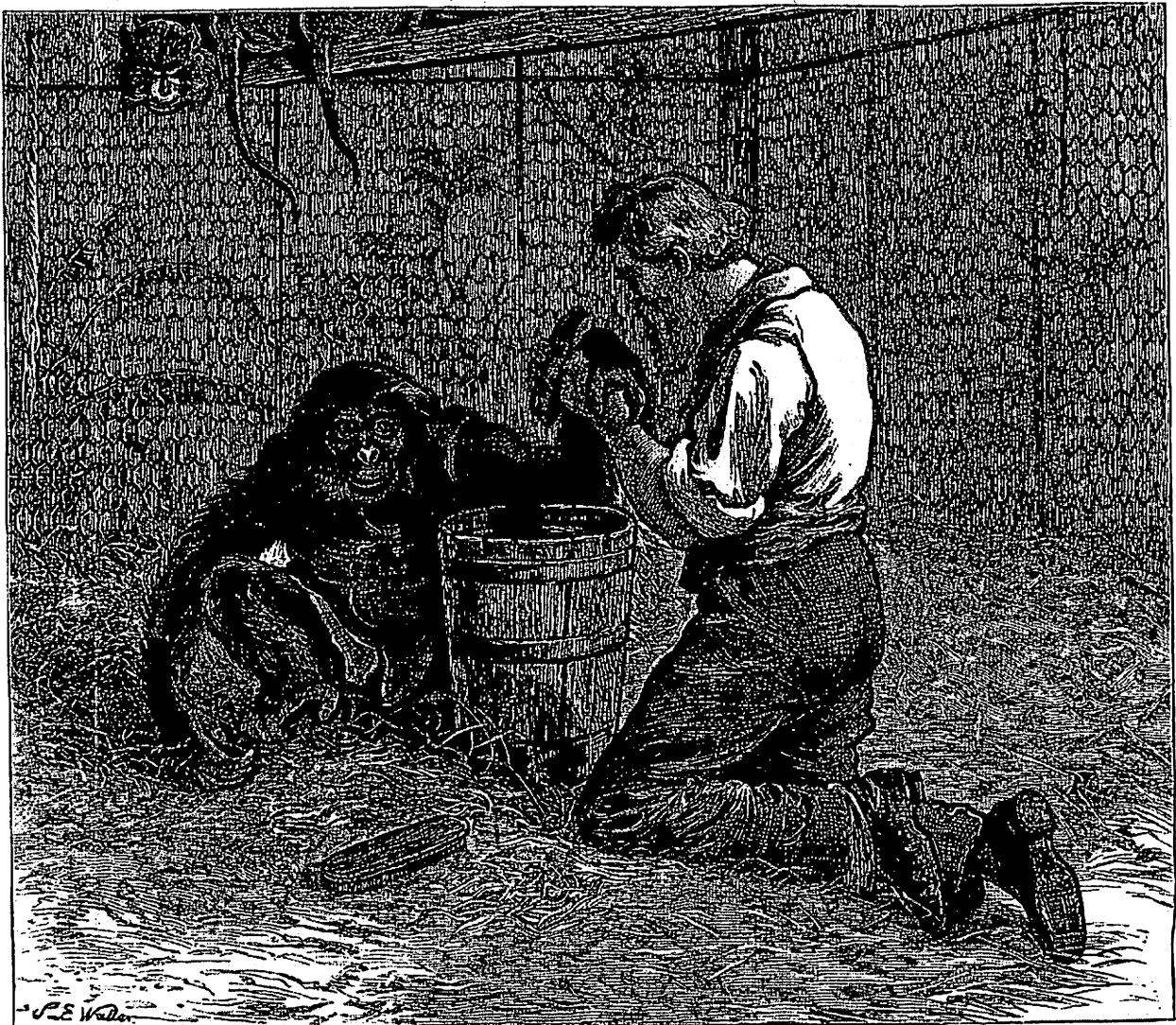
ZOOLOGICAL SKETCHES.

The first illustration on this page represents a young male Javan rhinoceros, from Batavia, believed to be the first one of this variety ever

imported into Europe. It was purchased by the Zoological Society of London for \$4000. Our second illustration represents the celebrated gymnastic chimpanzee "Joe," well known to visitors at the London Zoological Gardens.

"Joe" died in March last, of consumption, contracted by exposure during cold weather. During his last illness he was carefully nursed by his keeper, to whom he was very fondly attached. He was good-natured and tractable, and seemed

to take pleasure in showing off his gymnastic skill, and would shake hands with visitors and open the door for them with the utmost politeness. "Joe" had but one fault—he was a most adroit pickpocket.
