Thanks to the kind assistance of Sir Edward Hallstrom, a large group of Australian reptiles was added to the collection. Among them are: five Diamand Pythons; Tiger Snakes; the Australian Copperhead; the Death Adder; Australian Blacksnakes; and a Taipan, one of the world's most dangerous snakes.
