# PILOT WHALE GIVES BIRTH

A 1,300 pound Pilot Whale, captured in coastal waters only a few days before, gave birth on 28th January last, in a tank at the Sea World Oceanarium - but a few minutes later went into a frenzy and drowned her 100 pound offspring.
