On 20th October, 1966, two Orang Utan babies arrived at the Blijdorp Zoo. This young pair was deposited by the O.U.R.S., the Orang Utan Recovery Scheme in Sarawak.

The Detroit Zoo suffered a great loss when 'Sadie', the adult female Orang Utan died on 9th September, 1966. 'Samu', her last baby born on 9th July, 1966 is being cared for by zoo personnel and is doing very well in his foster home.

Another sad loss this fall was the death of a male Black Rhinoceros.

Among the fall births are: twin South American Tapir babies; a Hyrax; Formosan deer; and some Crab-eating Monkeys; a South American Tapir; a Siberian Tiger cub; a Llama, number 9 of this season; Formosan Deer; Barbados Sheep; Rock Hyrax; Crab-eating Macaques; Mud Snakes and Rat Snakes.

St. Paul - Minn. - U.S.A.

The Siberian Tiger cubs born during September 1966 lived only a few days. This was the second litter for the new Siberian Tigers, neither of which survived more than a few days.

New in the collection of the Como Zoo is a pair of Colobus Monkeys.

Trinidad - West Indies

Within the past two years the Lioness at the Trinidad and Tobago Zoo has given birth to 14 cubs, having two litters of 2 in 1964 and two litters of 5 in 1965. Although five in a litter is not a record, it is however uncommon for a Lioness to have two consecutive litters of five healthy cubs within a year.

Twycross - England

Recent births reported at Twycross Zoo (near Atherstone, Warwickshire) include a Spectacled Langur baby, being the third to be born this year; and a male Alpaca.

New arrivals are a pair of Zebras and two Brown Woolly Monkeys with babies.
