They write from Vienina, that the Emperor will have in the Field this Summer' 45000 'fighting Meń of his own Forces, and 35000 of Auxiliary Troops, and that it was believed the Campagne would be opened with the Sicge of Alba Regais.
Bruffers, March Ig. Our Governor Gencral is mow at Gaunt, and isexpected here to morrow. The Chevalier de Laufuy arrived here this week In his way to Eung 4 ry, where be intends to ferve the next Campagne. The Letters from $V$ iemne of the $\tau$ th Inflant tell us, that a confiderable Sum of Money had been fent to General Caprarat, for the payment of the $I$ mperial Troaps upger his $\mathrm{Com}_{1}$ mand. That General Cerafia, who, after the ctat king of $S t$. fob, auvanced as far as Detrezen to raile Contributions, was recturned to his Quarters. And that the Imperialifts had taken the Fortreqf of Sebwur, friguated between Feffri! and Alba Regalid.
Brufels, Máarch 26. Our new Maifire de Camp General has not yet received his Patent, bate expects it by the next Sjpanijb Or. dinary. Count Salhzar, who is named by our Go, vectior Gencral ta go for Engknd, to make bis Compliment to his Majeffy upon his coming to this Government, beiing recovered of his Indifipo. fition, intends to part from hence towards the end of this weck. The Letters from Lille of the 2oth Infant inform us, that the Marecthal. ${ }^{2}$ 'Humieres was returned thither from the Coure of Frence.
