Lolkiew , February 18.

HE Count Ceinki, who was lend by the Emperour about Two Monohs ago to the Hopodar of Valachia, to make some Overtures to induce him to quit his Engagements with the Turks, and to enter into an Alliance with the Emperor and this Crown; is come back, and has given the King of Poland ap account, that the Holpodar, having notice of his approach to the place of his Relidence, lent-one of his chief Ministers to delire him to advance no far-ther, and to receive what Proposals he was charged with, for that he could not himself see him, without giving jealousie to the Turks, which might be very prejudicial to him. The Count thereupon declared his Commission to this Person who came to meet, him; but, finding by his manner of rece, h ing it, that he could not promise himself any luccels in his Megotiation; did not think fit to flay for the Holpodar's Aniwer, but halfned his return hither, that he might from hence inform wis Imperial Majesty of his proceeding, and expect his farther Orders. We have Affice that the Grand Vi-fier Solyman has written to the Prince of Transitusnia, and to the Holpedars of Moldavia and Valachia, to have their Forces ready to join the Ottomia Army in the beginning of May, affuring them, the ber-cer to difuse them to comply with this command, that the Grand Signior will Protect them against the Arms of the Christians, and will make those Principalities Hereditary to their Children. Vienna, March 7. We have an account from Opper Hungary, that General Caraffa having left a good Christon in the Foreress of St. Fob, advang eed to Debrezen, to oblige that City to pay the Contributions they had submitted to, after which, the weather being very cold, he returned to his Quarters. They write from Zolnocke, that the Count de Peterbaly had surprized a Party of Turki, and taken leveral Priloners, among which were two Aga's, who, its faid, have offered a very cossiderable sum of Money for their Ransom. But at the same time we are told; that the Turks had fallen upon some of our Foragers, and had cut off about 100 Men. We have like wife advice, that the Imperialists, having drawn together Köth Budb, Dompray Papa and Peprinduarched with several pieces of Cannon and Morents towards the Castle of Ishbuar, which very much incommoded them, and made themselves Mass. is of it, the Turks in Garilon there, so soon as our Cannon and Morears began to play, desiring a Parley, and afterwards Capithating, to march. a Parley, and afterwards Capith ating, to march out with what they could carry on their tacks; The Imperialists have put a good Garison into the place which is scituated between Fesprin and Alba We have an account from the Turkilly quarters, that the new Grand Visier has changedall the Commanders in their Frontier places; that he has caufed leveral Baffa's, and other principal Officers who ferved the last year in the Afmy of Hunga-H, to be strangled and that he has made Bassa Abdas Amon Serasquier or General of the Ortoman Forces in Hungary, ti & he declar'd at the fame time that he, would go himtelf into the field this Sumer; and that his Army may be composed of the best Troops the Turkthave left, those that served the fast Campagne against the Poler are, it's said, ordered to come into Hungary, and the new-rand Forces will be employ'd bir that fide, with which are to joyn, the Farsurs, the Moldavians, and Falachians. Some persons who came lately from Gran affure us, that there is such want of Provisions in the Turk'sh Ferritories, epecially towards the Frontiers, that the propletal forced to feed upon Acorns, which causes a great indreality among them. The Duke of Lordal Istepested here the beginning of all next month india hiprack, to allikara great Council of Wat that is applicated to be then held for the regulating the Operations of the Campagne. Co.ogue, March 23. The Officers that are ma-

king Levies in these parts for the Emperor's Service, have almost compleated them. The 19th Instant the Body of the Prince de Mourbach was buried with great Solemnity in the Cathedral Church of this City. The Bishop of Strasburgh is not now expected at Bonne till the beginning of the next Month. The last Letters from Hungary told us, that General Caprara was marched with several pieces of Cannon and Mortars, to attack the Castle of Montgatz. That a Detachement drawn out of the Garisons of Reab, Comorra, Papa and Vesprin, had attacked and taken Sebwar, the Garison surrendring upon Articles. They write from Vienna, that the Emperor will have in the Field this Summer 45000 fighting Men of his own Forces, and 35000 of Auxiliary Troops, and that it was believed the Campagne would be opened with the Siege of Alba Regalis.

Bruffels, March 19. Our Governor General is now at Gaunt, and is expected here to morrow. The Chevalier de Lausus arrived here this week in his way to Hungary, where he intends to serve the next Campagne. The Letters from Vienna of the 7th Instant, tell us, that a considerable Sum of Money had been fent to General Caprara, for the payment of the Imperial Troops under his Com, mand. That General Caraffa, who, after the ta king of St. Joh, advanced as far as Debrezen to raise Contributions, was returned to his Quarters. And that the Imperialifts had taken the Fortrass of Sehwar, scituated between Vesprin and Alba

Regalu.

Brussels, March 26. His Excellency returned hither the 20th Instant from Flanders, having vifited the most important places of that Province, and examined the design that had been proposed to him for the enlarging the Canal between Gaunt and Bruges, and that between this last place and Oftend, and for the making a new one from Gaunt to the Schelde, that fo Vessels of good Burden may pals from Offend to Antwerp, without going about as now they do by the way of Zealand; but we do not yet know what resolution his Excellency has taken upon this Project. On Sunday last arrived here an Extraordinary Courier from Madrid, who, its faid, brought his Excellency Orders to make a Reform in the Councils here, and to suppress all Pensions, pursuant to the resolutions that have been lately taken at that Court. Our new Maistre de Camp General has not yet received his Patent, but expects it by the next spanish Ordinary. Count Salazar, who is named by our Gosvernor General to go for England, to make his Compliment to his Majesty upon his coming to this Government, being recovered of his Indispofition, intends to part from hence towards the end of this week. The Letters from Live of the 20th Instant inform us, that the Mareschal d'Humieres was returned thither from the Court of France.

Hague, March 26. The Imperial Minister here makes great instances to obtain the payment of the Arrears of Sublidies that remain due to the Emperor from this State. Prince Walderke has been at Maestricht to take a Review of the Garison (which has been lately [reinforced) and to give fuch Orders as he thought necessary for the secu-rity of that place. The States General have a-gain written to the Duke of Zell, and to the City of Hamburgh, very earnefly pressing them to put an end to their Differences by an amicable componing.
