A NEW RHINOCEROS AT THE ZOOLOGICAL GAR-DENS .- By the kindness of Mr. Bartlett I have been enabled carefully to inspect a very remarkable animal which has just been added to the collection in the Zoological Gardens. It is a hairy rhinoceros (Rhinoceros Sumatrensis). This animal has never before been seen alive in Europe. It was purchased of Mr. William Jamrach, who got it from Singapore. It had been captured in Malacca six months before in a pitfall. There is reason to believe that it is quite adult, even though it is comparatively of small size, measuring only about three feet six inches at the

It has a tuft of hair like a curtain fringe round the edge of each car.
