

THE VICEBOY'S SPORTING EXCURSION.

(FROM OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT.)

JALCUTTA, FEBRUARY 26.

The following telegram, dated 25th, has been received from the Kuch Behar shooting camp :—
“We started from Camp at nine o'clock. In the first beat a fine rhinoceros was driven out to the Hon'ble Charles Harbord, who drove it back with a shot to Prince Christian Victor. The Prince put a couple of shots, driving it back into the dense nulse jungle. Mr. Bignell, who was guiding the line, turned back and managed to hind it, but on reforming the line and beating back a tiger broke and the rhinoceros was left in the heavy nul. The line was formed at an angle, and at the second beat the tiger, or rather tigress, broke exactly in front of his Excellency the Viceroy. His Excellency's first shot went clean through both shoulders, and the second shot killed her. This was his Excellency's first kill. On the way home line was formed and deer and other small game were bagged.

“On Wednesday the party went out six miles on a pass close to the Government forests, and breaking through the very heavy piece of nul, thirty-five feet high in places, drove out two fine rhinocrosses. One of them—the bull—was neatly killed by Surgeon-Major Fenn and the other by the Hon'ble O. Harbord and the Chevalier Scheibler. After luncheon line was made for general shooting, and the bag was seven fine deer and other small game.”
