THE NEW RHINOCEROS.—An example of the new species of rhinoceros (*Rhinoceros Sumatrensis*), brought over by Mr William Jamrach, has been safely deposited in the gardens, Regent's Park, having been purchased by the Zoological Society. The den which contained this huge beast was built entirely of teak, and was of immense proportions—so large that the gateways of the Society's menagerie would not admit of it. Mr Bartlett, the resident superintendent, therefore determined to back the trolley on which the den was placed against the park palings, having previously removed some of them, so as to admit of the back of the den being run upon the bank. Shortly after four o'clock Mr Jamrach entered the den, and secured the rhinoceros with stout ropes by the fore and hind legs. The order was given to remove the end of the den, which was promptly obeyed. The animal exercised extreme caution, as she carefully looked round immediately on quitting her "box." Mr Bartlett had, however, taken every precaution; and, ordering his assistants to take a pull at the leading rope, away she walked to her new abode, snorting violently as she went along. Beyond that she did not exhibit any signs of tamper. She is now located in the elephant house, in the next apartment to the male Indian rhinoceros. About a month ago there was landed at the East India Dock a smaller rhinoceros of the same species, but it was immediately transhipped to Hamburg, where it is now located in the Zoological Gardens of that city.—*Telegraph*.
