Private correspondence from Alexandria of the 16th ult. states, that Mehemet Ali was so well pleased with the impression which his submission to the Sultan had produced, that he was preparing other presents to be forwarded to Constantinople on the return of the Nile steamer. These presents were to consist of a female rhinoceros, seven magnificent horses (Nedgdis), with their housings, composed of rhinoceros hides. This rhinoceros was sent from Abyssinia, by Hussein Pasha, in the year 1836. It was anticipated at Alexandria, that the coalition of the four Powers would be dissolved, and that even a war might arise amongst the contracting parties. It was likewise considered certain, according to private information received from Constantinople, that the Sultan could not survive six months longer. An expedition was preparing at Cairo to act against the Sherif of Mecca, who it was said, was about to declare himself independent. It was likewise reported that the Iman of Sana was marching against the Holy Cities at the head of 40,000 cavalry. The Viceroy continued to strengthen the fortifications of Alexandria, and the artillerymen were frequently obliged to remain under arms all night. Mehemet and Ibrahim Pasha enjoyed the best of health, and, in fact, the father had a more robust and juvenile appearance than the son. They were frequently seen together in the same carriage, contrary to the usual custom. Ibrahim Pasha had been appointed to the direction of all the manufactures of the country, as well as to the administration of the army and navy. In addition to those appointments Mehemet Ali had placed the entire of the Delta, with the exception of his own private farms, at his disposal. The Government was about to take the administration of the Customs into their own hands, and to place a duty of 12 per cent. on all produce exported. The Pasha had concluded a sale of all the cotton remaining of last year's crop to Messrs. D'Anastasy and Fignia, at 13 talaris the quintal. He bound them by agreement to receive from 25,000 to 40,000 quintals at this price. They were to pay him at each arrival of the French steam-boat 25,000 talaris. It was reported that Messrs. Briggs and Co. had proposed to the Pasha, on the part of the Steam-Navigation Company, to permit merchandise from India to pass through Egypt, on paying one half per cent. for the passage, and that the Pasha was favourable to the proposal. This measure, however, could only be applied to the importation of fine articles, as large vessels cannot navigate the Red Sea. The plague still raged at Alexandria, but with diminished violence; the cases had decreased from 247 cases and 106 deaths in the month of May, to 65 cases and 30 deaths in the month of June. The other towns of Egypt were perfectly healthy.
