1. Mound Builders—*Homo sapiens*.—From the ancient mound graves of Boone county, Mo.
2. Gorilla or Man Ape—*Gorilla gina*.—This family, of husband, wife and child, is from West Africa—the native haunts of the species.
3. Chimpanzee or Wild Man of the Woods—*Simia troglodytes*.—Blumenb. Guinea coast and the interior of Africa. Lives in pairs or families.
4. Proboscis Monkey or Long-nosed Ape—*Nasalis larvatus*.—Geoffr., Island of Borneo.
5. Baboon or Dog Ape—*Presbytis prianus*.—Eschsch., Southeastern Asia.
6. Maccacus Ape—*Maccacus nemestrinus*.—Geoffr., Asia.
7. Night Monkey—*Nictopithecus felinus*.—Spix, South America.
8. Prehensile-Tailed Monkey—*Cebus capillatus*.—Erxl., South America. Lives in trees.
9. Sharp-Clawed Monkey—*Arctopithecus marmoratus*.—South America. Habit, arboreal.
10. Ring-Tailed Lemur—*Lemur catta*.—L. Madagascar.

47. Elephant—*Elephas africanus*.—Blumenb. African jungles.
48. Hippopotamus or Water Horse—*H. amphibius*.—L. Central and South Africa. Passes most of its life in the water.
49. Peccary—*Dicotyles torquatus*.—Central and Southern N. America. The native swine of this country.
50. Caribou, American Reindeer—*Rangifer caribou*.—Aud. et Bach. Northern portions of United States and Canada. Probably a variety of European Reindeer.
51. Alpine Chamois—*Rupicapra rupicapra*.—Sund. Alps and Pyrenees, Europe.
52. Giraffe—*Camelopardis giraffa*.—Middle and Southern Africa. Lives in droves.
53. Zebra—*Equus zebra*.—Mountains of Southeastern Africa.
54. Rhinoceros—*R. indicus*.—Cuv. India and Southern Asia.
55. Manatee or Sea Cow—*Manatus americanus*.—Desm. East coast of and Central America and South. In the mouths of rivers.
A true herbivore and ruminant mammal; nevertheless it lives submerged its whole life.
56. Skull of Greenland Whale—*Balæna mysticetus*.—Cuv. Greenland and southward.
57. Great Ant Eater—*Myrmecophaga jubata*.—L. Eastern part of S. A. Eaten by Indians and wildcats.
58. Nine-Banded Armadillo—*Dasypus novemcinctus*.—L. Texas to South America.
59. Wombat—*Phascolomys wombat*.—Per. et Les. Australia.
