FIFPHANTS AND RHINOCEROS

Str.—The following is an extract from the letter of a friend in Kenya Colony:

"I was watching one herd (of elephant) when I saw a rhino, his wife and 'Toto' grazing among them, and a young elephant sparring with one of them; this is, I think, an unheard of thing as rhino will generally clear miles when a herd of elephant are about.
