statement on the net figures for 1929? These would give an entirely misleading idea of the comparative numbers of fish entering the river in 1929 and before.

In fact, though there have naturally been fluctuations, there is no doubt in my mind that the numbers of spring fish have decreased consistently since 1929.

From Sir Eric Studd, Bt.


SIR,—I enclose a photograph (*below*) recently taken in the Amboseli Game Reserve in Kenya.
