A Zululand correspondent writes: "In South Africa the rhinoceros is gradually retreating northwards before the advance of the white man, but in northern Zululand he is still a common object of the countryside and not a particularly pleasant one, unless one happens to be on hunting bent, for the animal is extremely dangerous and liable to

charge without provocation. In this neighbourhood—St. Lucia Bay—rhinoceroses are often encountered by travellers, and such an incident as is here shown is not uncommon, the animal on this occasion charging the horse and trap, and only being arrested by a well-placed shot between head and shoulder."
