## Black rhino births in Kenya exceed number lost to poachers

Black rhinos are holding their own in Kenya with the number of calves born in 2017 exceeding the number of animals lost to poachers in the three wildlife conservancies (OI Pejeta, Borana and Sera) that are supported by Fauna & Flora International (FFI), the conservation organisation reported.

Ol Pejeta Conservancy has reported the births of six calves last year, further boosting the largest black rhino population in East Africa. Borana Conservancy also recently saw its seventh birth, while Sera Wildlife Conservancy – which has the first community-owned rhino sanctuary in Kenya where black rhinos were reintroduced in 2015 – reported its first birth.
