**ZOOLOGICAL SKETCHES.**

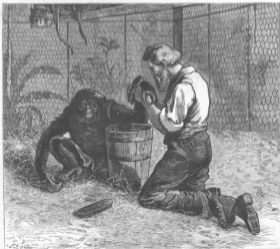
The first illustration on this page represents a rhinoceros from Sumatra, Java, believed to be the first one of this variety ever

imported into America. It was purchased by the Zoological Society of London in 1861.
