GRAND CELEBRATION.

Military Festival, at the American Museum, in Broadway, opposite St. P. O.'s Church.

IN commemoration of the Evacuation of 1783, the American Museum will be presented for public patronage, and the utmost exertions will be used to effect a truly splendid celebration. The following attractions will be presented.

The Military will pass the building during the day, when a fine opportunity presents itself of viewing the whole from the balconies and roof, which also commands a fine view of the whole city and surrounding country. In the evening the military will visit the Museum, having been invited.

The Doy Visiter. will be amused by the Minstrels from Genoa, who will perform during the day and evening, and will, accompanying their curious instruments, sing several songs and trions in their native language.

GRAND COSMORAMA.—During this week the Cosmorama will be set with views of remarkable places in different parts of the globe; the whole delineated with a degree of accuracy truly astonishing. This Cosmorama is the only one in America, and is larger than any in Europe; requiring 100 optic glasses to exhibit the pieces.

THE SPLENDID CASE OF CUTLERY. manufactured by Pooley & Co. (exhibited at the late Fair, where the makers were presented with a silver medal) is now placed in the Museum for exhibition. They are splendid specimens of native ingenuity.

The American Museum was founded in 1810, by John Scudder. It was formerly located in the Park, but has recently been removed to its present location.—This Museum contains the largest collection of curiosities in the United States, and is daily receiving additions.

RHINOCEROS SKULL.—Just added, the skull of a Rhinoceros lately received from Africa; also, the Large Rattle Snake that bit himself to death on Monday, Oct. 24th.

Hippopotamos—The skull of the Hippopotamus is this day added, and is a great curiosity.

The Illumination—In the evening the whole building will be illuminated with gas, when the public will behold the most extensive display of gas lights in America. On this evening the American Museum may well be denominated the *Park Light House!*

The Music—A full military band will perform during the evening a variety of popular and national airs.
