arrangement of so many South African hunting "trophies," is now engaged upon modelling a specimen of the white rhinoceros, shot by Mr. Charles R. Varndell, in Zululand, and greatly prized by naturalists because of its being a practically extinct species. We have to go lack to the days of Gordon Cumming to learn of the white rhinoceros in great numbers in the Dark Continent; nowadays the progress of civilisation, as well as the ubiquity of the "sportsman," is bringing the num-

bers of the species to vanishing point.
