
# BORN IN EUROPE, FIVE BLACK RHINOS FIND NEW HOME IN RWANDA

Five critically endangered black rhinos, born and bred in Europe, were in June flown from Czech Republic to Akagera National Park in Rwanda in the largest ever translocation of rhinos from Europe to Africa. The historic journey began at Safari Park Dvůr Králové, Czech Republic, where all five animals had lived since November 2018. The eastern black rhinoceros (Diceros bicornis michaeli). who were born and raised in zoo environments, will ultimately be released into their new and wild home in Akagera. The translocation was a collaboration between the European Association of Zoos and Aguaria (EAZA), the Government of Rwanda and conservation NGO African Parks.
