Notwithlanding this Account he gave of his foreign Marriage, yet, while he was under Sentence, a poor young Woman came often to the Prefs-yard Door to fee him, folemnly declaring that they were married, and that the living in and about Rag Fair, kept three Children whom the had by him, in great Mifery and Diffrefs. This Marriage he at first demied, alledging, they only had lived for some Time together; but being afterwards prefs'd to declare the Truth, he owned they were married, adding withal, what does it signify? I was married to several Wives.

He behaved while under Sentence tolerably well, professing Repentance, and, it is to beshoped, he died a true Penitent.
