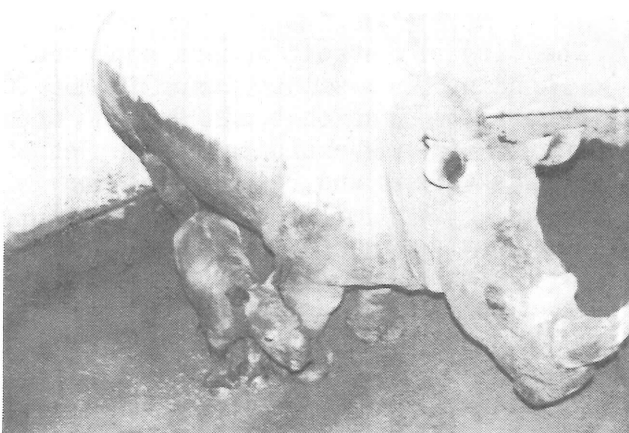

KNOXVILLE ZOO ANNOUNCES
SOUTHERN WHITE RHINO BIRTH

The Knoxville Zoo announced the recent birth of a female white rhino, the twelfth successful birth since the herd was established in 1974. Three of four females have produced thirteen offspring, one a stillborn calf. In accordance with SSP recommendations, the zoo will seek to exchange males in the near future.
