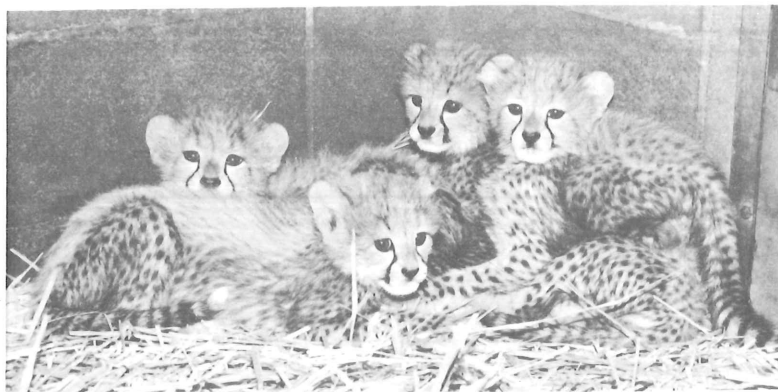


**HONOLULU ZOO
REPORTS
BIRTHS AND HATCHINGS**

A litter of five cheetahs (*Acinonyx jubatus*) was born on 13 April at the Honolulu Zoo. This was a first for the zoo and the three-year-old female. Four (2.2) cubs survived and are thriving on exhibit with their mother. The female was born at the Columbus Zoological Gardens, and the ten-year-old male was born at Amersfoort Dierenpark, The Netherlands. The



pair was first introduced to each other in Honolulu in November 1992. The zoo participates in the cheetah SSP®, and its cheetah population now stands at six.

The zoo also successfully hatched its first pair of Raggi's bird-of-paradise (*Paradisaea raggiana*) from parents that were wild caught in Papua New Guinea. The one surviving chick hatched on 3 July. Four superb bird-of-paradise (*Lophorina superba*) chicks hatched in 1993, bringing the total to ten surviving birds from twelve hatchings since June 1991.



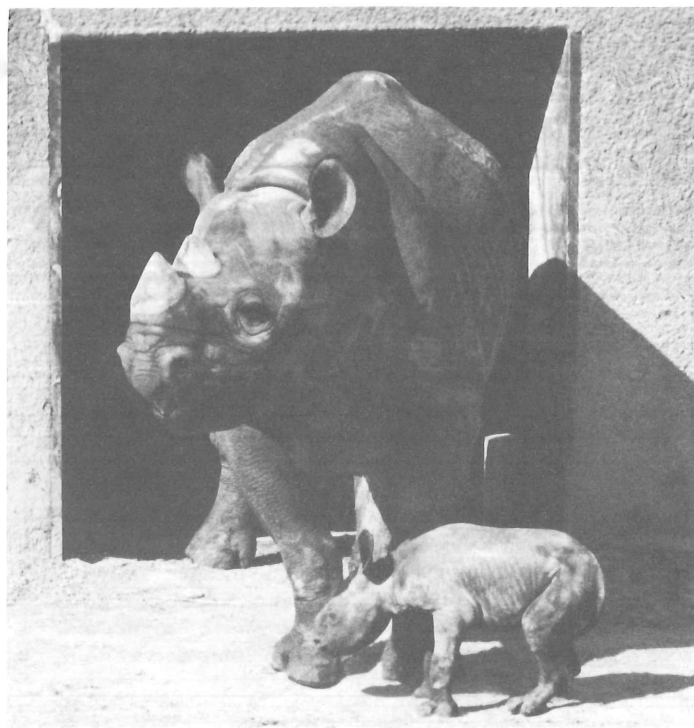
