The Rhino Trust

Samia, a ten-year-old rhino and Samuel, her seven-month old son, died on Wednesday, November 23 after being chased over a cliff by a male rhino at the Lewa Wildlife Conservancy in Kenya. Anna Merz had hand-raised Samia since the rhino was only three-days-old. Through the close relationship that Samia and Anna Merz shared, Merz gathered a tremendous amount of information about rhino behavior, which has been very beneficial to researchers.

Through Merz's dedicated work, she was able to successfully release captive-bred Samia into the wild. The birth of Samuel provided the invaluable opportunity to observe the maternal behavior of a hand-raised rhino. The goal was for Samuel to develop and adapt naturally proving that captive animals can be returned to the wild with success. The unfortunate death of Samia and Samuel is significant because fewer than 2,400 black rhinos exist in the wild due to poaching and habitat loss. With a limited population where the rhinos are isolated from each other, breeding and maintaining genetic diversity pose a serious challenge.

The Rhino Trust supports the operation of *in-situ* rhino reserves and promotes education and awareness of all five species of rhino. For further information about Rhino Trust programs, including member-

Riverbanks Executive Director Elected President of IUDZG-WZO

Palmer "Satch" Krantz III, Executive Director of Riverbanks Zoological Park and Botanical Garden, Columbia, SC, was elected President of the International Union of Directors of Zoological Gardens — The World Zoo Organization — at its recent 50th Annual Conference in Dublin, Ireland.

Krantz, who will serve a two-year term, is one of only four Americans ever elected to the position. He has served as Riverbank's Executive Director since 1976 and is a past-President of the AZA.
