

Second Generation Indian Rhino Born

A great one-horned Indian rhino, born at the Bronx Zoo/Wildlife Conservation Park on 28 December 1995, is one of the newest additions to the zoo's Wild Asia habitat. Weighing 120 pounds at birth, the rhino weighed 520 pounds in mid-May. The baby's mother was born in 1986 and is the first rhino ever reproduced at the zoo, which is now home to seven rhinos. *L. New Exhibits Completed at the Ellen Trout Zoo

New wallaby and emu exhibits have been funded and constructed at the Ellen Trout Zoo by the Lufkin Kiwanis Club. The project involved removing 230 feet of chain-link fence and renovating two old displays. Club members installed a 40-foot viewing deck and 230 feet of fencing, separated from the viewing deck by a six-foot-wide planter. Shelters were remodeled and grounds landscaped. The \$3,000 project required 250 man hours. Thus far, the Kiwanis Club has contributed over \$50,000 in materials and labor to help improve the zoo.

Another new exhibit constructed in-house with funds provided by the Friends of Ellen Trout Zoo is the flamingo exhibit. This display occupies a focal point in the zoo with Chilean flamingos and lush tropical landscaping. *G. Henley*

Indian Rhinoceros Exhibit Opens

Two greater Indian rhinos are on display at The ZOO, Gulf Breeze, Florida, in a 3/4-acre exhibit that opened last December. The adult female and her one-

year-old calf came to The ZOO from San Diego Wild Animal Park. The exhibit is offset from The ZOO's thirty-acre wildlife preserve and incorporates a dry sandhill, swamp, and wallowing hole.
