THE VICEROY'S SHOOTING TOUR.

VICEBOY'S CAMP, March 29th.

The Viceroy and party commenced shoot-
ing from Sahibgunge Camp to-day. The
Viceroy killed a heavy tiger measuring nine
feet six inches. Several deer and other
small game were bagged on the way home.
