THE VICEROY'S SHOOTING TOUR.

VICEBOY'S CAMP, March 29th.

The Viceroy and party commenced shooting from Sahibgunge Camp to-day. The Viceroy killed a heavy tiger measuring nine feet six inches. Several deer and other small game were bagged on the way home. The party consists of Mr. W. Lawrence, Major Baring, Colonel Pears, Resident in Nepal Colonel Gordon, B.C., Major Armestrong, Surgeon Fenn, Captains Wigram, DeOrespigny, Portman, and Lord Suffolk.
